

## Pavilion Restoration Project – Report 5

We finally managed to open our newly restored Pavilion as our indoor seating area at the end of October 2019. It is always going to come in most useful during the winter months as it gives our customers somewhere warm and dry to sit and enjoy the views and watch the bird activity on the feeders.



We now have some special lighting in place individually designed by Wellington resident [Adrian Reynolds](#) and made at his local workshop in Crudgington. The main feature on this lighting are oak leaves in various colours which add to the unique feel of the place and totally suit its woodland location. We also have scans of some of the old postcards of the Halfway House kindly supplied by Bob Coalbran (and funded by Veolia through a grant to the [Shropshire Wildlife Trust](#)) around the walls so you appreciate both the history of the house and the wider area.



Under normal circumstances we are open at weekends and during school holidays although we were planning to extend our opening times gradually. When we are open, we serve a variety of hot food and refreshments including tea, coffee, snacks, soft drinks and water, sandwiches, paninis, bacon butties and potato fritters.



We are happy to hire out our Pavilion for a range of events such as birdwatching talks, art and painting groups, yoga sessions, school orienteering groups and business away days.
